





PAA engaged the assistance of 935 volunteers who contributed to various initiatives such as delivering meals to older adults, offering support at dining centers, delivering presentations to caregivers in monthly lunch & learn programs, providing legal services, conducting safety check-in calls for older adults, and actively participating in the Caring Neighbors volunteer program.

In total, these volunteers dedicated 26,928 hours of in-kind service to PAA, and the estimated value of their contributions is \$442,001.



During Fiscal Year 2023, PAA successfully maintained the service levels achieved in Fiscal Year 2022, thanks to increased funding from the Older Americans Act (OAA) during the COVID pandemic. While the additional funding was utilized by the end of the fiscal year, the organization faces the challenge of adapting to a thirty percent reduction in OAA funding, necessitating the adjustment of programs and services.

Despite this challenge, the organization remains committed to preserving services for current clients, and although waiting lists for services, especially home-delivered meals and in-home care, have been reinstated, there is positive news to share. Notably, there has been significant growth in services for veterans and in contracts with private healthcare payers. This upward trend is expected to persist, providing discretionary income that can help bridge service gaps resulting from the loss of COVID-related federal funds.

Looking ahead, PAA's future success hinges on the organization and its staff being adaptable and innovative at every level. Ensuring continued success involves embracing new opportunities, finding creative solutions to challenges, and holding both ourselves and others accountable to goals and progress while staying true to our core values.

We express our gratitude for your partnership as we embark on another year of dedicated service to older adults and caregivers in our community.
